On Friday the 1<sup>st</sup> of March, I joined with others in attending the World Day of Prayer that was hosted this year by our friends at Boghall Parish Church.

The theme of this year's service was 'I Beg You...Bear With One Another in Love,' inspired by Ephesians 4 vv 1-7.

The service had been prepared by a group of ecumenical Palestinian Christian women who have worked collectively, the last 4 years, to pray and reflect on the theme and now they are inviting all people around the world to join them in prayer and action.

This service, you will see, was prepared well before October 2023 and before the troubles in Gaza started.

The service was touching, made more so, with the ongoing crisis in Gaza.

Pray for peace in the Holy Land, the birthplace of Jesus our Saviour. Pray also for peace in Ukraine.

## **Communication Working Group**

The communication working group is responsible for looking at all aspects of how Bathgate Parish Church communicates both internally and with the wider community.

There are three current streams of communication that we are working on –

#### The Church Magazine

The group proposed to Session that the Church magazine should be produced quarterly. This allows the magazine to be targeted at certain times of the year so that information about events around the town can be shared. An edition in mid-March allows information about services and events over Easter to be shared. Similarly, an edition at the beginning of December allows arrangements for the Advent period to be shared. Further editions in June and September mark the end and beginning of the traditional sessions for organisations. While having only four editions a year gives bigger gaps than we may have been used to, it allows a real focus on articles. If there are more immediate issues to be shared, this can be done by intimations in church and by our online provision.

A competition was run at the end of February to choose the name for the new magazine and 'Connected' was chosen. This name was proposed by Emma, one of Crawford Morgan's granddaughters.

#### The Church website

It has taken a good few weeks, but the new Bathgate Parish Church website is now up and running. This has meant a change to the name to reflect the name for our new united church and also a change to the email address.

The general church e-mail address is now info@bathgateparish.com and there is an e-mail for the Session Clerk at <a href="mailto:sessionclerk@bathgateparish.com">sessionclerk@bathgateparish.com</a> Any e-mails to the old bathgatehigh.com emails will be forwarded to the new addresses. The church website remains fairly static as it balances visits from within the congregation and from outside. The church carries information about our worship, with links to the previous week's live stream, information about organisations, contact information and directions and a 'This week' column for up-to-date news. The worship resources page on the site is where we post reflective materials at Advent, Easter and for special events throughout the year. For purely practical reasons the Bathgate Parish Church website was developed from the Bathgate High Church website. Now that the website is up and running, Shona is collating new photographs of church life to bring the content more up to date.

### The Church Facebook Page

This does a different job to the website as it is our social media face. It hosts the weekly livestream of our worship and allows for feedback through 'likes' and comments. Some groups, the Pre-School, for example, have their own Facebook pages alongside the main page. As with most social media, the Facebook page is updated on a day-to-day basis if necessary, so is a very effective 'Stop press' for up to date news and often carries pictures which are worth a thousand words!



#### St John's Complex - Closing Service

It is with a huge mixture of emotions that Bathgate Parish Church prepares for the Easter Sunday Service on 31st March. This service will be held in the St John's buildings and marks the last service time that this complex will be used for regular Sunday worship. The closure of any church building is a time of great sadness, but for those for whom this was their spiritual home for years, or generations, the pain is even greater. While there will be sadness, the Session is keen that this service should be as much as possible a celebration of the life of St John's and its contribution to our community. A number of invitations have been sent out to those for whom St John's has been a special place, or who have made special contributions to the life of the church.

While this service marks a particular milestone, it is important to understand the context in which it sits. St John's *buildings* may close, but the church has not. The church has *united* and now forms part of Bathgate Parish Church. Presbytery was keen that the two Bathgate charges unite to form a new church with a more positive outlook for the future. Neither St John's nor the High Church has survived, but, together, we now are part of Bathgate Parish Church. With God's grace, we will not survive, but thrive.

#### One more step along the ....

Now, in case you hadn't noticed, the act of union is not the end of the line. As a new charge, Bathgate Parish Church, we now have the task of calling a minister. As with many processes within the Church of Scotland, this can be a long-drawn-out affair with a number of different steps —

## Confirmation of the electoral roll

The congregation has to take votes in order to appoint the Nominating Committee and in calling the minister. It is very important, especially when two rolls are being amalgamated, that everyone who is eligible to vote is named on the electoral register so that they can be allowed to vote. People who are allowed to vote are; full communicant members, members on the Supplementary Roll and Adherents – people who are not members here or of any other church but are regular attenders who play an active role in church life. Intimations were read out in church to invite anyone who believes that they are an adherent, but is not currently listed as such, to apply to the Kirk Session to have their status confirmed. Similarly, people attending who are members of another church should arrange to transfer to Bathgate Parish Church so that they can take part in any voting.

## **Appointment of the Nominating Committee**

The Nominating Committee is normally made up of an odd number of members – not necessarily Office Bearers – whose task is to undertake the formal steps in the calling of a minister. In the case of a Union, it is normal that there is a balance of members from the two original congregations. The tasks for the committee include the collation of the Parish Profile, a description of the life of our church and our visions for the future, preparing the advert, assessing applications and visiting and interviewing prospective candidates. The Nominating Committee then make a recommendation to the congregation who have the final vote on whether or not to call the sole nominee. The Nominating Committee are supported by a Vacancy Support Committee appointed by Presbytery, but who have no say in the recommendations or appointment. One or more members of the Vacancy Support Committee are due to meet with Session on 21st March to give advice on the processes involved.

We are keen that members with a vision for the future of the church and an idea of how they see a minister fitting with that vision would feel free be a part of the Nominating Committee. With typical Church of Scotland convolutions, rather than volunteer for the Nominating Committee, you need to be proposed by another member. If you feel that there is someone that you would like to propose it is very important that you discuss this with them and have their consent for your proposal prior to the congregational meeting to form the Nominating Committee.

Whatever your part — big or small - in the process we would encourage everyone in the congregation to take a thoughtful and prayerful approach.

## **Bathgate Parish Church Foodbank**

Firstly, and most importantly, can I say "thank you" to everyone who has donated to the Foodbank. We do appreciate the tins of soup, the packets of cereal and bottles of juice that are handed into the large hall on a Tuesday morning or left in the box in the church vestibule. These appear on a regular basis and are always a pleasant surprise to us. We also appreciate the gifts of money that comes to us via the offering plate, the church office, or personally. A few of you have also started giving regularly through a standing order at the bank - which can be gift aided. We are grateful for it all and to each and every one of you.

We continue to be busy each week, although some weeks we are particularly so. Perhaps this is due to when each client receives their money. They run out of money before they run out of week/ fortnight/ month. In the future, I would love to see budgeting classes alongside simple cookery classes. We are always reminding some Foodbank users about prioritising their needs.

We are also aware that there is very little job security. Clients have been delighted to leave us because they have managed to obtain a job, but their contract (if they get one), is only short term and they come back to us once more.

Our customers continue to be varied in age, family size and outlook. We have quiet ones and others whom we have to quieten; those who are certain of what they want and others who accept anything. All the Foodbank team know that they are stewards of the gifts of money and food you give us and we do our best to act fairly to each customer.

After all, we are all God's creatures and everyone is unique.

### **Finance Matters**

This note provides information regarding new financial governance arrangements, the forthcoming annual report and accounts for 2023, the sort code and account number to be used for giving, Gift Aid and office contact details.

The Kirk Session recently agreed new governance arrangements for Bathgate Parish Church, which means that in future the Session will meet every two months. Five new working groups will also meet every two months, between Session meetings. One of these working groups is the Finance and Property Group, which held its first meeting on 15 February 2024. The group comprises 13 members and is chaired by Dave Robertson, Property Convener. The vice-chair is lan McLean, and the clerk is Crawford Morgan.

A new Treasury Team has been formed, comprising Crawford Morgan, Treasurer, Ian McLean, Deputy Treasurer and Jean Greenock, Financial Administrator. David McComb, previously Treasurer of Bathgate St John's Church, is standing down. Many thanks to David for his five years of service in that role.

The Annual Report and Accounts for 2023 for both the previous High Church and St John's Church will be presented for approval by the congregation at the annual stated meeting, which is scheduled to take place on Sunday, 12 May 2024.

Bathgate Parish Church has two accounts with the Royal Bank of Scotland, Bathgate Branch. The sort code and account numbers are as follows: –

General account - Sort code – 83-16-05 Account number - 00110297 Fabric account - Sort code – 83-16-05 Account number – 00149991

The general account should be used for regular giving. The fabric account should only be used if you wish a proportion of your giving to be earmarked for fabric purposes.

These are the sort codes and account numbers previously used by Bathgate High Church. Consequently, members of the former High Church do not need to amend the sort codes and account numbers for their giving, however, members of the former St John's Church will need to make amendments to have their giving credited to the new church account.

A standing order form for general account giving is included with this newsletter. If you require a standing order form for fabric account giving, then please contact the church office. We encourage giving by standing order, which is now used by many members of the congregation. Anyone still wishing to donate by WFO envelopes, please contact the church office or any elder. Please state whether you are a gift aid donor or not.

If you pay income tax, the church can claim an extra 25p for each £1 of your giving from HM Government if you sign a gift aid form. We would encourage everyone who is able to do so to complete a gift aid form if you have not already completed one. Former High church members already signed up to claim gift aid do not need to sign again but, unfortunately, former St John's members are required to sign a new form.

Standing order forms and gift aid forms are available from the church office or can be collected in the church vestibule. Completed forms can be returned to the office or handed to any elder.

The church office is open on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 10 am until 12 noon and can be contacted on telephone number (01506) 650517.

More volunteers are required to enable the office to open on a Thursday and also to form a reserve pool to cover for holidays, sickness or other appointments. Any member wishing to volunteer can visit the church office when open or contact the Treasury Team.

There is also a vacancy for the Gift Aid Convenor post. Any member wishing to volunteer can visit the church office when open or contact the Treasury Team.

The formation of our new church is a great opportunity for a fresh beginning, as we come together, seek to Call a Minister, and pray for new opportunities to do His will here in Bathgate. This may be a good opportunity to prayerfully consider your level of giving, especially if you have not reviewed your giving for some time.

### Christian Aid Week 2024

#### 12-18th May 2024

Push back against poverty this Christian Aid Week.

Poverty is an outrage against humanity. It robs people of their dignity and lets injustice thrive. Alini Nibogora, a determined mother in Burundi, was pushed to the brink of survival by poverty. She was a victim of abuse, spurned by her community and forced to flee. She lost almost everything. Separated from her children, she had to sleep on the streets. "People forgot I was human," she told us. "I don't want my children to have a painful life like mine."

But there is hope. Together we can push back against the inhumanity of extreme poverty.

Churches can help fund the training that enables a community like Alini's to form a **Village Saving and Loans Association [VSLA]** that will support people to grow food, buy medicines and improve their living conditions. Together, we can help ensure more people in Burundi get the skills and knowledge they need to fulfil their ambitions and hopes. We can help families plan for a better future that they'll build together.

Many fundraising events will, no doubt, be undertaken by individuals and church communities.

Under the umbrella of Bathgate Churches Together, Bathgate Parish Church will be holding a Coffee Morning on Sat. 18th May 2024 from 10-12 to raise funds for CA. [This would normally be our monthly coffee morning.] Christian Aid envelopes will be available at the coffee morning and at church services.

## **Bathgate Churches Together**

In January the churches joined in the services for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. The materials were prepared by an ecumenical team from Burkina Faso and the theme chosen was "You shall love the Lord your God----and your neighbour as yourself: [based on the parable of the Good Samaritan].

There were three services during the week and despite the stormy weather at the first service, there was positive feedback from our gatherings. Following discussion, it was agreed that we may adapt the material in future to suit our own context.

The group met on 1st Feb. to plan ahead for Lent and Easter. Lent Study groups have been taking place in St Columba's Episcopal Church on a Tuesday afternoon, led by David Graham-Service and on a Thursday afternoon at the E.U.URC Church, led by Morag Crawford. These are worthwhile times of discussion, sharing our thoughts and experiences and reflecting on our faith as we journey through Lent.

The World Day of Prayer Service, held this year at Boghall Parish Church, was a blessing and very relevant as the material was written by the Women of Palestine. We are all horrified by the ongoing war in Israel and Gaza and the cost in terms of human loss and unimaginable suffering. We continue to pray for an end to this conflict and for peace and stability to be restored.
